Welcome to the INK Library

Last fall, when I joined INK, I was eager to get my hands on the library books, especially those relating to mystery writing and crime. Now, as the new INK librarian, I have the 23 books on my spare room shelf. A quick survey divides them into three categories: Fiction Writing, Mystery/Crime Writing and "Other".

The first category includes ten books that are relevant to all genres of fiction writing. They cover the specific (plot, viewpoint, scenes, story structure and creating dynamic characters) as well as the broad (Stephen King's excellent book *On Writing: A Memoir of the Craft.*)

Another nine books deal with writing mystery and crime. They tackle the art of crafting mystery stories (*Sue Grafton's edited Writing Mysteries: A Handbook by the Mystery Writers of America*), crime scene investigation and the nitty gritty of body trauma and forensic medicine.

As for the four "other", these include a folder on *Canadian Military Law* and instructions from a *Policeman's Notebook* (officers are told to describe the interviewee's speech as soft, loud, refined, vulgar, foreign, lisp or rapid). For pleasure, we have a quartet of mystery novellas and for party fun, there is the *Writers' Brainstorming Kit* complete with flash cards.
